# HOLIDAY "OPEN" HOUSE AND HISTORY DAY AT MARY'S LAND FARM

Mary's Land Farm

After months of deliberation, the Historical Society board reluctantly decided that the annual Holiday House Bus Tour - a tradition since the 1970's – would not be possible this year. Trying to find owners comfortable welcoming several hundred guests into their homes and concerns about

packing those people into multiple buses during a pandemic were key factors in our decision to pivot to an alternate program. We were fortunate that the owners of Mary's Land Farm, off Sheppard Lane in Clarksville, stepped up and opened their Organic Farm Complex to our members and guests on Sunday December 12th for a day of History Tours, Family Activities, and Holiday Shopping.

Mary's Land Farm is a 162-acre property, originally a tenant farm on Charles Carroll of Carrollton's 10,000acre Doughoregan plantation in the middle of the county. Louisa Carroll Taylor sold the property to her tenant James Treakle and his wife Henrietta in 1877. The Treakle family had farmed the property since the farmhouse was constructed in 1825. James Treakle (1808-1881) was also a deputy sheriff, a state-appointed official inspector of grain, and eventually a Howard County Commissioner. In 1880, just before his death, he deeded the property to his four sons, Edwin, Thomas, Albert, and Emmett, all of whom had fought for the Confederacy during the Civil War. The Treakle family's private graveyard remains on the property. Following the death in 1909 of Emmett, the last surviving Treakle son, Charles G. Linthicum bought the farm and it then

### Executive Director's Message



embers, first and foremost, thank you for your continued support of the Howard County Historical Society. We are in a period of transition at HCHS and I wanted to take this opportunity to identify some changes to staff and alterations to this year's Holiday House Tour.

Mary Sanphilipo's last day as Museum Manager was Sept. 30th. Mary started as a volunteer with the Historical Society working out of the archives. We hired Mary to take over as Collections Manager at the Museum and then eventually she took over as Museum Manager, she was responsible for the day to day operations of the museum, rentals, special events and managing the volunteer staff. Mary was responsible for bringing the very popular Yoga classes to the museum. Mary has been a very special member of our staff and we wish her well in her future endeavors.

Paulette Lutz has resigned from her position as Deputy Director. Her last day was Oct. 20th. I just don't know if I can explain how important Paulette has been to the Historical Society over the past decade. Paulette has served the Society in many different ways during her tenure; she was a volunteer researcher, a member of the Board of Directors, President of the Board of Directors, Volunteer Coordinator, and most recently Deputy Director. Paulette has been the main organizer for the Holiday House Tours, choosing houses for the tour and developing the day long program and bus routes. Paulette was also instrumental in working with the National Park Service on the Underground



Railroad Trail sites in Ellicott City in 2014, securing markers for the Circuit Courthouse, the Howard County Historical Society Archives, and the Heritage Orientation Center (the Old Courthouse which was washed away after the flood of 2018). Her contributions and service to the Society are vast and immeasurable. Her knowledge of Howard County History and the

Archives will be sorely missed. A lifelong Howard Countian, Paulette is officially retiring (for the second time) and looking to move to the Eastern Shore. We plan on honoring Paulette and her service at next February's Annual Meeting, currently scheduled to be at the Miller Library.

Fred Campbell has been promoted to Deputy Director. He will assume Manager Duties at the Museum of Howard County History as well as Collections Manager responsibilities for the remainder of the year. Many of you have met Fred, who previously served on the Board of Directors, but resigned in order to join our staff filling a much needed position at the Archives. Since May, Fred has done an amazing job of completing the backlog of accessions and has completely reorganized collections spaces at both the Museum and Archives. He also organized last month's National Road Bus Trip, which was very popular with the members who attended. Fred taught US History at Howard Community College and was International Travel Coordinator for the Study Abroad Program. He brings a wealth of knowledge on US history and a knack for public programming that we look forward to utilizing here at the Historical Society in the future.

Due to continuing COVID concerns, we have decided to change up the format for this year's Annual Holiday Event. Instead of a Bus Tour, we are partnering with Mary's land Farm in Clarksville for what we are calling, The Holiday "Open House" Family History Day at Mary's Land Farm on Sunday Dec. 12th from 1:00 - 4:00. Our feature article in this issue of the legacy gives more details, but we envision a more family oriented Holiday experience at one of the most spectacular historic farm sites in the county. We will have activities for all ages.

We thank you for your continued support of our organization as we navigate the challenges presented the last two years due to the Pandemic. As we stand today, the Historical Society has 583 members, the highest number of active members in the organization's history. We could not do what we do without all of you. •



passed through a series of owners until 1940, when the property was sold to the Rea family.

In 2014, Gratia Plan, LLC. acquired the property and the new owners have completely renovated the original Treakle farmhouse into a spectacular Bed & Breakfast now known as The Inn at Mary's Land Farm. The farm's mission is to educate the public about and raise healthy animals, fruits, and vegetables in a regenerative ecosystem, maintain the highest ethical standards for products and their caregivers, and make it possible for their family and ours to benefit from access to responsibly-raised delicious, fresh, and nourishing food. The Treakle Farm is a working example of an early 19th-Century tenant farm, common on former colonial estates, that was passed on through a series of individual farmers who adapted to changing times but continue to farm the land and keep Howard County's agricultural traditions alive and well. Unlike many county properties with similar origins, the Treakle and Carroll families would still recognize this property today.

The Society's 2021 holiday event will take place on Sunday December 12th from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m., bringing a historical focus - designed to appeal to members who are used to attending our annual bus tour - together with a variety of activities sure to bring out families and individuals attracted to the wonders of nature and the promise of adventure in a day at the farm. Outdoor activities (weather permitting) will include: docent tours of the Treakle House (The Inn), Ice House, and Spring House, wagon tours of the farm complex, live animal encounters (featuring sheep and goats), a blacksmith demonstration, and The Mary's Land Farm Store will be open to the public during the event - with discounts and special deals for our guests. Inside the heated pavilion, special treats will include holiday music and refreshments, craft and activity tables for all ages offered by our partner historical organizations, wreath making workshop, photo ops with Santa Claus, a chef-led cooking demonstration, and holiday gift shopping. At 3:00 p.m. a special guest speaker will deliver a lecture.





This event will be FREE for all individual and family members of the Howard County Historical Society current or brand new - but all attendees must register with the Historical Society prior to December 12th. We are happy to announce that the Bob Lucido Team of Keller Williams Integrity will, once again, sponsor this year's event, allowing us to offer the variety of activities listed above. As a fundraiser for the Historical Society, we will be selling raffle tickets online prior to the event and the featured prize will be a one-night stay at The Inn at Mary's Land Farm. The drawing will be in the pavilion just before the lecture begins at 3:00 p.m., and you do not have to be present to win! We are looking forward to a wonderful, family-friendly event - especially as we prepare for the April 2022 opening of the new Ellicott Mills Children's Museum in Ellicott City. Please join us. # NATIONAL ROAD TOUR

In the early part of this republic's history, newspaper editor Horace Greely, along with a few others, is credited with saying, "Go west, young man, go west." On September 4th 2021, men, women, young and young at heart went west—west to Boonsboro, Maryland on the Howard County Historical Society's National Road Tour.


Construction of the first nationally sponsored road began in the first decade of the 1800s. It runs right through Howard County, mostly on what is now Main Street in Ellicott City and Frederick Road through the rest of Howard County. Lined with mile markers, historic locations and abundant historical events, the National Road has a little bit for everyone.

As our bus rolled through the hills of Howard County, participants learned about famous wagoneers such as Henry Puffenberger, Jacob Breakiron and Robert Allison. We also covered the unique history of Hardman's Tourist Home where WWII German POWs gathered to go to work on farms in the area. Not

one or two, but three invasions of the North by Confederate forces during the Civil War were played out in part on the National Road. A road marker in Cooksville covers the action that took place. These facts among many other were shared during the drive.

Lunch was at Brewer's Art in Frederick, then the group was off to Boonsboro to get a behind the scenes look at the National Road Museum, which will open in 2022. Tiffany Ahalt, our host, showed the guests photos and artifacts from the museum's collection. The Howard County Historical Society was able to donate a collection of postcards that featured the National Road going back to the early 1900s.

Our day was informative and full of comradery. We returned to the Museum of Howard County History in the afternoon having seen a lot of our wonderful county and other venues out west. Please consider joining us on a future bus tour in the new year. All are welcome. \*



# From the Stacks



Sometimes while working in the Archives, a series of papers will pass in front of you that make you tilt your head sideway and say, "What?!?" This is what happened while reviewing the contents in a box labeled "Howard County Misc." In that box, among other things, was a folder containing an application, contract, and various other sundries concerning the Tusco Donkey Ball Co. of New Philadelphia, Ohio. It appears that A. P. Lindo was contracted by Charles Arrington to bring Donkey Ball to West Friendship on August 24, 1970.

Based on the game of baseball, the game of Donkey Ball according to promotional material featured "prominent business and professional men, and other well-known personalities in a competitive game and mounted on trained donkeys."

Expecting a decent sized crowd, Charles Arrington, who was connected to the church group "St. James Circuit Riders," asked for 350 adult and 150 children's tickets. After submitting the \$25.45 payment to the State of Maryland Tax on Admissions and Amusements, and signing an indemnity agreement, the event was ready to go. According to the indemnity agree payouts for some of the accidents were as follows: Loss of life: \$1000; loss both hands and feet \$1000, loss of one hand and entire sight of one eye \$1000. No claims were made.

According to the score sheet, this game was drawn on political lines with Democrats and Republicans making up



the two teams. The Democrats featured Bob Fischer, State's Attorney, at short stop mounted on Carbide, and Hugh Burgess of the House of Delegates at third on Rusty. The Republicans had Bob Kittleman at center field on Moe and Orrin Brown, State's Attorney also on Rusty (it appears the donkeys were non-partisan). The outcome? Republicans won ten runs to nine. Photos of the game itself were not included in the folder.

If any readers of this article were in attendance, the Historical Society would love to hear from you. Until our next Legacy edition comes out, "Play Ball!" \*
